January 19, 2011 5:00am

With 96% snowmaking coverage and consistent top rankings for snow quality amongst the Vermont ski areas, it's hard to argue Okemo doesn't have some of the best snow in the East. The 632 acres of terrain and 2,200 feet of vertical (the most in southern Vermont) mean there's something for everyone here. For those looking for a little different type of adventure, there is also access to cross-country skiing, tubing, and a fitness center.



#### FEBRUARY 9, 2011 5:00AM

The long-awaited Mittersill chair will be open in time for this trip! Cannon opened access to the old area in 2009 and added a chair this season. It results in an extra 86 acres of backcountry skiing. Cannon feature the highest elevation and longest vertical of any ski area in NH. It's a classic New England ski area, and it just keeps getting better!



# **A Brief History of Mittersill**

- 1933: Taft trail was constructed. The Taft ran from the top of Cannon Mountain down to the saddle with Mt. Jackson, up over Mt. Jackson, then down the north slope.
- 1938: Aerial Tramway opens. Baron Hubert von Pantz arrives in the U.S after fleeing Austria, where he had been renovating the Schloss Mittersill.
- 1941: The Baron purchases 550 acres on the north slope of Mt. Jackson, including a section of the Taft trail.
- **1946:** Mittersill opens for business
- 1950: Mittersill begins early experiments with snowmaking, based loosely on a lawn sprinkler system.
- 1969: Lifts include 2 T-Bars and a Hall Chairlift, with a vertical drop of over 1000 feet.
- 1980-81: Winter sports suffer and Mittersill feels the effects.
- 1984: Mittersill closes.
- 1989: Special Use Permit from the US Forest Service is terminated. The privately held lands on which most of the ski area was located were transferred to the State of NH for the cost of one dollar, an effort spearheaded by the Valar family.
- 1990-2009: Mittersill becomes overgrown, although some parts of it had been kept clear by individuals, in spite of state and federal restrictions. The area is home to several federally listed sensitive species. There remained lift towers, top and bottom terminals, and miscellaneous lumber.
- March 25, 2009: 100 acres of the upper portion of the dormant Mittersill Ski Area becomes part of Cannon Mountain Ski Area due to an exchange of federal and state lands.
- March 28, 2009: The official "rope cutting" ceremony takes place on the Taft Trail, reopening the Mittersill ski area as part of Cannon Mountain.
- **Summer 2009:** Trail trimming and clearing begins. An agreement was reached, limiting the cutting on the site to match the 1989 trail and lift footprint. The agreement limits any new lift to a double chair but also protects the sensitive species inhabiting the area.
- Winter 2009-10: Cannon opens the Mittersill area as lift-accessed backcountry (via the existing Cannon lifts). Crews complete some thinning and brush cutting for ease of access. Shuttles run on weekends and holidays to bring skiers back from the base of Mittersill.
- Summer 2010: Installation of the Mittersill Double Chair begins.
- January 1, 2011: Recent snow allows Cannon to open the new chair!
